The Essential Questions that will guide our learning in this course are:

- How do artists represent or make sense of the world around them?
- How can I effectively communicate my ideas to others?
- What problem-solving skills do I need to create art?
- How does art record and communicate the human experience?
- What is the role of the artist in our society?

Philosophy of Art Education:

- Art education is concerned with the organization of visual material. Acquiring proficiency in art
 requires systematic instruction in how we see, interpret and make sense of visual stimuli. It requires
 an education in the use of traditional and contemporary tools, materials and media.
- Art education is concerned with **having individuals think and behave as artists**. Ultimately, art is accessible to all individuals. Its practice results in changing the individual, in changing the relationship among individuals, or in changing the social/physical environment.
- Art education is concerned with pointing out the values that surround the creation and cherishing
 of art forms.
- Art education deals with ways in which people express their feelings and communicate in visual forms.
- Art education deals with making and defending qualitative judgments about artworks.

Learning Objectives for Art 9:

Students will...

- · record objects alone and in compositions.
- · employ and arrange elements and principles of design to make compositions.
- · use expressiveness in their use of elements in the making of images.
- · use the techniques of art criticism for analysis and comparison of artworks.
- · create compositions in both two and three dimensions.
- become familiar with the use of transparency and opacity in the creation of compositions.
- · investigate the effects of controlling colour, space and form in response to selected visual problems.
- experiment with the principles of dominance, emphasis and concentration in the creation of compositions.
- · investigate the effects of modifying colour, space and form to change pictorial style.
- · consider the natural environment as a source of imagery through time and across cultures.
- · identify thematic and stylistic variations of works as characteristics of certain artistic periods.
- · become aware of the importance society places upon various works of art.

Course Content:

Perception – Learning to see as an artist (positive and negative space/Contour Line)
Value (Shading basics applied to compositions), Line to create form and pattern in Geometric Design
Surreal Eye drawing and application of line and value
Media Exploration: pencils, charcoal, pencil crayons
Linear Perspective
Examine colour theory and mixing
Learn and apply colour theory
Acrylic Landscape/Cityscape Painting (atmospheric perspective, tint/tone)
Analysis of lyrics and discussion of symbolism in art
Mixed media and design
